Later, More 500 acres of land was acquired for the re-location of Some FDMN who were under the risk of land slide and flood. Besides, extended area of Hakimpara, jamtoli, Putibunia in Ukhiya, Kerontoli, Unchiprang, Alikhali, Leda, Jadimura, NayaparaShalban and Shamlapur in Teknaf has been brought under the camp management system. The area used for the new camps is about 6,500 acres.

Besides, Hakimpara, jamtoli, Putibunia in Ukhiya, Kerontoli, Unchiprang, Alikhali, Leda, Jadimura, NayaparaShalban and Shamlapur in Teknaf are each designated as separate camps. As a result the number of total camps becomes 32. Officers posted by Ministry of Public Administration are assigned for administrative management of the camps.

Measures taken to protect from wild elephants		As the track and terrain for wild elephants has shrunk, there have been 12 deaths of attack by wild elephants so far within first four months in the new camp area of Kutupalong- Balukhali. To prevent these sort of incidents in future IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature) is working on demarking the track for elephant movement with funding from UNHCR. In addition, besides, 50 ERTs (Elephant Response Team) have been formed to prevent attacks (of) by elephants.
